Rev Henry Reiner Wilson and Mrs. Virginia Wilson

## **Henry Reiner Wilson** (28<sup>th</sup> December 1892 – 14<sup>th</sup> September 1984)

Born and brought up in Uttar Pradesh and son of Rev. D. Wilson a dedicated missionary in that time, Rev. H.R. Wilson was an able administrator and Educationist. He retired as Principal of Parker Inter College – Moradabad and settled in his own Home in Civil Lines in 1959. But the drive to continue serving in the field of Education motivated the old couple start the Wilsonia English School in 1966.

Rev. H.R. Wilson was the Chairman of the Building Committee of Methodist Mission in Moradabad and was the force that saw to the construction of the Philip Memorial Church – Near the Methodist Girls' College in Civil Lines – Moradabad, which has a Congregation of about 2000 families and is the most attended and awakened Church of the City.

## **Virginia Mahelaka Wilson** (4<sup>th</sup> July 1903 – 19<sup>th</sup> February 1992)

The Loving Wife of Rev. H.R. Wilson and Blessed Mother of Nine Children, with her quiet dedication to the Almighty she was a Life Long Companion of Rev. Wilson, she furthered the cause of Education at Wilsonia and put together the Song Book and Moral Education and Value Syllabus that is still adhered to at Wilsonia. The Song Book of the Group has many songs that were composed by her.

Her service to the Church has given her the Wonderful Title of 'Mother of Moradabad Conference' and is so revered and remembered for her untiring service to the Almighty.

# INTRODUCING WILSONIA



Wilsonia was founded on the 08th of July 1966 by Rev. and Mrs. H.R. Wilson in their Bungalow. The school got its name from the name of the Bungalow 'Wilsonia'. It is located in Civil Lines and has become an important landmark of the city.

Five Decades since its inception, Wilsonia still holds the privilege of being the city's most reputed institution. The school has expanded tremendously during the years and now has an identity of a split unit system.

## FOCUS OF EDUCATION

# WILSONIA COLLEGE CIVIL LINES, MORADABAD

Affiliated to the Council for the ISC Examinations – New Delhi



Wilsonia College is the Foundation School, it is from here that the Organization has sprouted into a Group. Started in Civil Lines, which in 1966 was just the residence of the Founders. From these humble beginnings the School has grown.

The School was affiliated to the Council for the ISC Examinations in 1982 and Class X was started. In 1988, the first batch of ISC – Class XII passed out from Wilsonia College. In the same year the New Building too was erected adjacent to the old building. This building was named after the Founder Mrs. Virginia Wilson and is called the VIRGINIA BLOCK.



# WILSONIA BOYS' SCHOOL

Virginia Block is the Group Headquarters, since the Office of the Director is in this building. Also this is now the Boys' School. From Classes II to Class XII and also hosts the Primary Wing that is called Wilson's Play House.



# WILSONIA GIRLS' SCHOOL

The need was seen by feedback received from the townsfolk to have a separate Boy's and Girl's School. Hence **Wilsonia Girls' School** is now located in the Old Block of the Group. The Girls' School is self sufficient with its own playground and teaching area, the Girl's come to Virginia Block for Practical's and for the Library.



## AFFILIATION

Wilsonia College is a recognized institution that is affiliated to the Council for the **Indian School Certificate Examinations**, which conducts two examinations. The Indian Certificate for Secondary Education (ICSE) examination is conducted at the end of Class Ten and the Indian School Certificate (ISC) is held at the end of Class Twelve. The Council is a well recognized board *all over the world* and allows students easy access to various degree courses and vocational courses like Engineering, Medical, NDA, BBA, B.Sc, CA, B.Com etc.





# THE COUNCIL FOR THE INDIAN SCHOOL CERTIFICATE EXAMINATIONS

## 1. Origin

The council for the Indian School Certificate Examinations was established in 1958 by the University Local Examination Syndicate with the assistance of the Inter-State Board for the Anglo-Indian Education. It is registered under the Societies Registration Act No. XXI of 1860.

## 2. Recognition

The Delhi Education Act, 1973, passed by Parliament, in chapter I Definitions Section 2(s), recognizes the council as a body conducting public examinations.

## 3. Constituents

The council as been so constituted as to secure suitable representation of Governments responsible for schools (which are affiliated to it) in their State/ Territories, the Inter-State Board for Anglo-Indian Education, the Association of Indian Universities, the Association of Heads of Anglo-Indian Schools, the Indian Public Schools' Conference, the association of Schools for the I.S.C Examination and eminent educationists. The Chief Executive and Secretary acts as the Chief of the Council.





## WILSON'S PLAY HOUSE

The Group's Primary Wing is called Wilson's Play House. This gives this wing its own importance, since this is the actual formative phase of the Child's nurturing and they require the most attention and development and sound teaching.

Located in the Virginia Block Extension, Equipped with Swings and Slides and other play way paraphernalia, with each class having TV's for entertainment. Even Audio Visual teaching along with Activity Based education and (as the name suggests) Play Way method of teaching is what is emphasized most in the Play House. Competitions, excursions, Games and Fun Activities like Smart Class Education is the new way to sound learning that is professed in the Wilson's Play House.





## CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Every child must participate in the co-curricular activities that the school has to offer. It is an integral part of the overall development of the child. Games, Physical Education, Competitions and other events help build a spirit of friendly competition, communication, teamwork and also a self-confidence in the students. - (a) Inter-House matches in various sports and athletic competitions are held each year and all the students are expected to participate unless they are exempted on medical grounds.

- (c) Literary and Cultural activities and Fine Arts also form an integral part of the school. The school holds Cultural and Literary Competitions each year, and every student is encouraged to take active interest in these activities which include Debating, Dramatics, Elocution, Essay Writing, Drawing and Painting etc. These activities are instrumental in bringing out the talent of the growing children and help in creating a more balanced individual.

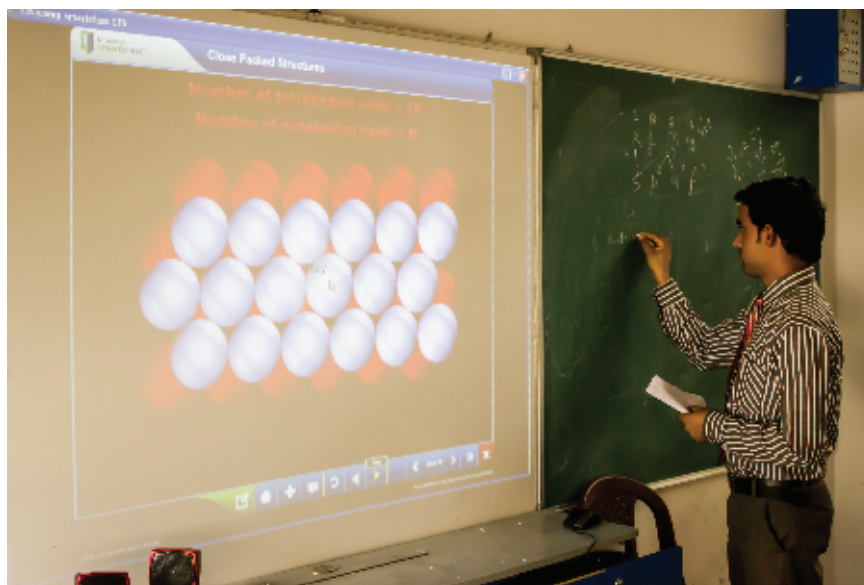
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# VALUE ADDED FACILITIES PROVIDED AT WILSONIA COLLEGE AND WILSON'S PLAY HOUSE

## SMART CLASSES

Audio Visual Education is fast becoming the norm of School Education and Wilsonia Group is a pioneer provider of this service in Moradabad. Smart Classes were started in 2010 and is part of the daily curriculum of students, lessons are devised keeping in mind smart class modules as well as the prescribed booklist.

Smart Class is the new teaching concept, teacher-led educational content based solution that has dramatically improved learning outcomes in Private Schools. Powered by India's largest Digital Content library of curriculum-mapped, multimedia rich, 3D content. These are tools that make smart class learning a more valuable teaching aid.



## BRAIN O BRAIN

Another innovative teaching skill being offered to the students is the Brain o brain abacus classes. The main objective of Abacus Learning is to train the students' mind during the brain's formative stages and hence help kids to attain whole brain development in a natural and stress free manner. It is said that the human brain undergoes 85% of its development, during the age of 5-14 years. The Chinese counting tool 'abacus' gets three senses involved while kids use it, Seeing, Hearing and Doing all simultaneously.

# ACADEMIC INFORMATION

## CURRICULUM

- (a) The school follows the courses prescribed by the Council for the Indian School Certificate Examination.
- (b) It is the institution's endeavour to provide a broad and liberal scope of education. So along with the traditionally taught subject viz. English, Hindi, Mathematics, Science, History and Geography, the school also teaches Art and craft, Accounts, Commerce, Classical and Western music. Indian classical is compulsory for all girls. Sanskrit or Urdu are taught as the third language up to class VIII.
- (c) In conformance with the school's focus of promoting correct values, religious and moral education forms an integral part of the curriculum. Moral science classes are held from Nursery to VIII. A short worship service is held every morning during assembly and is compulsory for all students.
- (d) General Knowledge is a part of the curriculum till class VIII.
- (e) Computer Study is compulsory from class III upwards.
- (f) No exams are held until class IV. Promotion is based on class performance and marks scored in the periodical unit tests.
- (g) Physical Education and Socially Useful Productive Work (SUPW) are an integral part of education for all classes.
- (h) Two streams of course are offered in both class 10 and class 12: -
  - (i) **Class 10** – Choice is given between Sciences (Physics, Chemistry and Biology) and Commerce. The rest of the subjects are compulsory viz. English, Hindi, Mathematics, Social Studies (History/Civics and Geography), and a sixth subject which can be either Computer Application or Physical Education or Economics
  - (ii) **Class 12** – A student can choose any FIVE of the following subjects with **English** that is the only compulsory subject. So the subjects available in the School for the ISC Examinations are:

**English, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Mathematics, Hindi, Computer Science, Economics, Accounts, Commerce, Physical Education, Environmental Education.**

## PROMOTION CRITERIA



- (a) The promotion of a student does not depend on the result of a single Annual Examination, but on the following conditions:
  - (i) The student should have made satisfactory progress in all subjects during the year.
  - (ii) All students **MUST** pass in English, a failure in English cannot be granted promotion.
- (b) Should a student fail to qualify for promotion, but has shown good progress in the year's work, he/she will be permitted to repeat the class only once.
- (c) Strict disciplinary action will be taken against any student who is found to have used unfair means in the class tests or examinations.
- (d) Every student must have 75% attendance of the total prescribed number of working days in order to be eligible to appear for the school examinations.
- (e) If a student fails in **four or more** subjects in the year's average, then he/she will not be kept in the school.
- (f) Students with exemplary participation in co-curricular activities and showing excellent talent may even be given bonus points.



## WILSONIA SCHOLARS' HOME

Wilsonia Farmland Branch was founded in 1993, it was the third Branch of the Group and for years operated as a feeder school for Wilsonia College. Situated in a plush and modern complex on the National Highway 24 – Delhi Road, just 11 kms away from Wilsonia College, this School has a vast open campus and is resplendent with scenic beauty and healthy and beautiful natural surroundings.

It was only from 2008 that the school started to function independently and was rechristened to Wilsonia Scholars' Home, since the School is a Residential cum Day school, so a 'Home away from Home'. In 2010, Scholars' Home attained affiliation to the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) New Delhi, and now functions completely as an independent Unit of the Group. In the year 2012 a new state of the art building too came up and in 2013 the first batch of X appeared in the C.B.S.E Board examination, Class XI was started in 2014 and in 2016 the first batch of Class XII appeared in the C.B.S.E Board examination. The results since have been most encouraging.





# ABOUT CBSE

## Historical Background

A trail of development marks the significant changes that took place over the years in shaping up the Board to its present status. U P Board of High School and Intermediate Education was the first Board set up in 1921. It had under its jurisdiction Rajputana, Central India and Gwalior. In

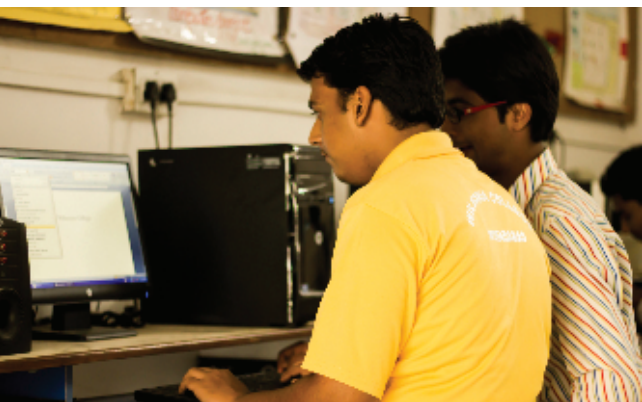


response to the representation made by the Government of United Provinces, the then Government of India suggested to set up a joint Board in 1929 for all the areas which was named as the Board of High School and Intermediate Education, Rajputana. This included Ajmer, Merwara, Central India and Gwalior.

The Board witnessed rapid growth and expansion at the level of Secondary education resulting in improved quality and standard of education in institutions. But with the advent of State Universities and State Boards in various parts of the country the jurisdiction of the Board was confined only to Ajmer, Bhopal and Vindhya Pradesh later. As a result of this, in 1952, the constitution of the Board was amended wherein its jurisdiction was extended to part-C and Part-D territories and the Board was given its present name Central Board of Secondary Education. It was in the year 1962 finally that the Board was reconstituted. The main objectives were those of serving the educational institutions more effectively, to be responsive to the educational needs of those students whose parents were employed in the Central Government and had frequently transferable jobs.

### **The prime focus of the Board is on:**

- Innovations in teaching-learning methodologies by devising student friendly and student centered paradigms.
- Reforms in examinations and evaluation practices.
- Skill learning by adding job-oriented and job-linked inputs.
- Regularly updating the pedagogical skills of the teachers and administrators by conducting in service training programmes, workshops etc.

# ACADEMIC INFORMATION



## CURRICULUM

The School follows the CBSE, New Delhi curriculum and has been adopting and evolving as per the guidelines from the Board.

The recent changes seen in the CBSE are evident in the changes in the School Curriculum as well. There has been a transition from the CCE to the Examination based evaluation especially for classes VI to X. The curriculum entails the following:

- The School follows the prescribed course of study as per CBSE
- In order to continue with the vision of providing overall growth and development to the students the curriculum encompasses teaching of Life Skills, Moral Values, General Awareness, Language speaking and Listening skills etc.
- The students have an option of Sanskrit and Urdu as the Third Language from Classes V to VIII
- Students study Computers from Class III to VIII and IT in classes IX and X.
- Physical Education / Music / Art and Craft are an integral part of the Curriculum and all students take part in the activities related to these subjects.
- Periodic Tests / HW / Projects/ Examinations etc form the evaluation process of the students and the cumulative efforts of the entire session are considered at the time of Promotion.
- For the Senior Secondary Classes ( 11 & 12) there are TWO streams of study offered to the students – Science and Commerce.

# PROMOTION CRITERIA



As such the following points should be kept in mind :

- a. All students **MUST** pass in English, a failure in English cannot be granted promotion.
- b. Should a student fail to qualify for promotion, but has shown good progress in the year's work, he/she will be permitted to repeat the class only once.
- c. If a student fails in **four or more** subjects in the year's average, then he/she will not be kept in the school.
- d. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against any student who is found to have used unfair means in the class tests or examinations.
- e. Every student must have 75% attendance of the total prescribed number of working days in order to be eligible to appear for the school examinations.

## Pass Percentage

- Classes 1 to 4 is 50% in each subject and the in the over all aggregate.
- Classes 5 to 8 is 45% in each subject and in the over all aggregate.
- Classes 9 & 11 it is 40% in each subject ( theory and Practical) and in over all aggregate.



# ADMISSION PROCEDURE FOR ALL SCHOOLS OF WILSONIA GROUP

- (a) Registrations for new admission are done at the end of each academic year, generally in the months of January and February. In order to register a candidate the following information must be supplied.
  - (i) Name of the candidate
  - (ii) Birth certificate in original for verification
  - (iii) The latest progress report of the last school attended.
- (b) After the above requirements have been submitted to the entire satisfaction of the Principal, the student's name will be registered on the Waiting List for the class applied, after the payment of the registration fees.
- (c) Registration of a candidate does NOT guarantee admission to the school, admission will depend on the following conditions:
  - (i) The student must have successfully passed the class previous to the one to which admission is sought.
  - (ii) The student must attain the prescribed minimum standard in the entrance test to be eligible for consideration for admission.
  - (iii) After qualifying the test and interview, admission will depend on the number of seats available for which the applicant is registered. If seats are unavailable in the School applied for, another School may be offered depending again on the availability of seats.
  - (iv) Admission will be granted at the sole discretion of the Principal. Special consideration will be given to applicants whose brothers or sisters are already studying in Wilsonia, provided he/she has qualified the entrance test and there is vacancy in the class and Branch applied for. Recommendations will not be entertained.
  - (v) The registration fee is valid only for one year. It is neither refundable nor transferable to another year.
- (d) If an applicant is found fit for admission, a *provisional offer of admission* will be made, which must be accepted within **One Week**, failing this, it will automatically be withdrawn. The acceptance of offer must be accompanied with:
  - (i) Birth certificate in original and an attested photocopy of the same.
  - (ii) Transfer Certificate from the previous school.
  - (iii) Payment of the following dues:
    - Admission Fees
    - Tuition Fee for one Unit (i.e. Two Months in Advance)
    - Other dues to the college such as Annual Dues, Bus Dues that is applicable.
  - (iv) The Principal reserves the right to refuse admission if the transfer certificate is not received on time, or if some flaws are found in the same. Under these circumstances the parent will forfeit the amount deposited towards admission fee.
  - (v) Should a parent decide on his/her own accord against sending the child to the school after completing all admission formalities and paying all dues, he/she will not be entitled for a refund of the same and will be liable to pay at least one Unit's tuition fee in addition.

# PROGRESS REPORT

- a. Parents are kept informed of the academic performance of their ward which is assessed by conducting Unit Tests for all classes. The record of progress is maintained in the student's diary and also in the Teacher's Diary. Record is also maintained in the office Master Marks Register.
- b. The Principal checks the Progress record of each student periodically and gives special remarks at the end of each term.
- c. Formal report cards are issued at the end of the Half Yearly Examinations, these are reissued at the end of the Final Examinations held April wherein the student's year end percentage, rank (classes V upwards) and promotion status are mentioned.
- d. Toppers of each class are awarded a special prize on the Day of Result Declaration
- e. Special awards are also given to staff and students who have 100% attendance during the year.



# DISCIPLINE



- a. Students are guided to honour school rules and accept desirable norms of behaviour. Care is taken to avoid severe infliction of punishment for the breach of conduct. As far as possible, students are expected to develop under the guidance and direction of the staff in general and the Class Teacher, House-Mistress and Dean in particular, who is constantly kept informed of the students conduct.
- b. Repeated acts of misconduct or dishonesty and failure to respond to the disciplinary measures taken by the authorities will lead to the expulsion of the student.
- c. For any acts of misconduct the student can be suspended for a length of time, fines may also be levied as punishment.
- d. Non payment of school dues, Continued Absence, Missing of classes can be considered reasons for the implementation of disciplinary action.



# SCHOOL UNIFORM

**SUMMER UNIFORM:** is worn from 01<sup>st</sup> April to 31<sup>st</sup> October and consists of the following:

## i. BOYS

- a. Classes Nursery to Prep (U.K.G) – Red Shorts, Check Shirt, School Belt, White Socks with Blue and Red Stripes and Black Shoes.
- b. Classes I to VI – Light Blue Shorts, White Shirt with Four House Colours stripes, School Belt, White Socks with House Colour Stripes. Black Shoes.
- c. Classes VII to XII – Light Blue Trousers, White Shirt with Four House Colours stripes, School Belt, White Socks with House Colour Stripes. Black Shoes.

## ii. GIRLS

- a. Nursery to Prep–Red Tunics, Check Blouse, School Belt, White Socks with Blue and Red Stripes and Black Shoes.
- b. Classes I to XII – Light Blue Tunics, White Blouse with Four House Colours Polka Dots, School Belt, White Socks with House Colour Stripes. Black Shoes.
- c. Senior Girls (Classes VI to XII) have the option of wearing *Kurta and Straight Pant* Suit with *Koti* in Summers

**WINTER UNIFORM:** is worn from 01<sup>st</sup> November to 31<sup>st</sup> March and consists of the following:

- i. Long Grey trousers for all boys Ladies Trousers for all girls.
- ii. White Full Sleeve Shirts and Blouses.
- iii. Maroon Blazer
- iv. Maroon 'V – neck' pullover may be worn under the blazer.
- v. Black shoes and socks as are worn in Summer.
- vi. School Tie is compulsory part of Winter Uniform
- vii. School Belt.
- viii. School monogram on the blazer pocket is compulsory for classes V upwards and School Name on the hip of the Sweater too is compulsory from Class I upwards.

**P.T. UNIFORM:** is worn only for special P.T. Programmes and during P.T. Periods. Children are informed well in advance when they are required to wear this uniform. It consists of the following items:

- i. House T-shirt.
- ii. White Shorts/ Skirts
- iii. White Socks and White P.T. Shoes.

The uniform must be well kept and students are expected to look neat and clean. Properly combed and cut hair, cut nails, trimmed moustache, polished shoes, clean socks etc. all are part of the proper school uniform.





# WITHDRAWAL PROCEDURE



- (a) One month's notice is required to be given to the Principal in writing if a student is to be withdrawn from the school.
- (b) Transfer Certificate will be issued only after the entire fees (Annual fees along with tuition fees) are paid in full. Failing this the Transfer Certificate will be withheld.
- (c) Government Employees who are transferred on account of government orders will be expected to pay only the Term's fees when they leave.
- (d) The Principal may at any time with or without assigning any reason ask a parent to withdraw his/her ward from the school, if she considers it in the interest of the school.

The following reasons are generally associated with the dismissal of a student: Unscrupulous behaviour such as Dishonesty, Immoral behaviour, Irregularity, Non Payment of Fees, Impunctuality, Impertinence, Poor Performance in Tests and Exams, Rudeness or insubordination.

In such cases at least two prior warnings are given before issuing a dismissal order. However if the offence is of a serious nature an immediate dismissal is also possible.



# PARENTS' VISITING DAY



- (a) Parents are not permitted to go into the classes as and when they wish, as this disrupts the normal routine of the class.
- (b) However, parents are permitted to visit the School and meet the teachers to discuss the problems and progress of their children on every Parents' Visiting Day, intimation for which is given by the school well in advance.
- (c) If parents have any special problems that require immediate attention, it is advised that they see the Principal, who will try her best to help them.
- (d) All complaints and problems must be sent to the Principal in writing or may be written in the students' dairies for the perusal of the teacher.
- (e) Parents are requested to go through their children's dairies regularly and note down the comments and notices that are written by the teachers therein.
- (f) A School Annual Calendar is issued at the start of the session detailing the year's fixtures and intended holidays, dates for tests and examinations and events, Parents are advised to go through the Calendar for reference regularly

Parents' co-operation is very necessary for the school and parents must realize this. Full support is required from them as it is their ward's future that the school is trying to develop.
